

Canada Soccer's National Championships U-17 Cup serves as a pinnacle event to the 2025 season, bringing together competitive clubs from across the country. This year's edition will be played in Kamloops, British Columbia from 8 to 13 October with 12 teams in the boys' division and 12 teams in the girls' division.

Canada Soccer will deliver all key information pertaining to its national amateur competitions via www.canadasoccer.com/competitions.

The 24 qualified teams for the 2025 National Championships U-17 Cup qualify through their respective provincial league and cup competitions that run from September 2024 through September 2025. As part of the Youth Competitions Network, 790 teams have taken part in 2024-25 / 2025 league and cup competitions leading to Canada Soccer's PDP Championship and youth National Championships.

COMPETITION FIELDS & FACILITIES



In all, 52 matches will be played across the boys' and girls' divisions at the National Championships U-17 Cup, with the Final Matches played back-to-back on Monday 13 October.

All 52 matches as well as all booked training sessions will be scheduled at the McArthur Island Park, 1655 Island Pkwy, Kamloops, BC.

Matches will be played on multiple fields all located at McArthur Island Park. All fields feature natural grass with dimensions of 100m x 64m.

Training Windows: one 60-min slot per team on 6 & 7 October at McArthur Island Field 6 and 7. Additional requests coordinated via LOC (14-day notice required).

Dressing Rooms

Two permanent team rooms and four temporary team rooms per competition field at McArthur Island Park. Gatorade & water stocked pre-match by Field Coordinators. Dressing-room keys issued to Team Managers; teams lock rooms when vacant.

Athletic Therapy / First Aid

AEDs located in all buildings around McArthur Island Park; additional AEDs will be provided by St. John's Ambulance paramedics on-site. On-site athletic therapist at each field from one hour before kickoff through to the final whistle. Medical HQ clinic inside competition headquarters (Unit 101-1550 Island Pkwy).

Technical / Spectator Areas

Only accredited staff and players are permitted in the technical area.

It is important that Participating Clubs, their players, staff and fans all respect the fields and facilities accordingly. Clubs are expected to keep their benches clean and tidy after each match or training session.

MEDICAL FACILITIES & PHARMACIES

First-Aid services will be provided for all matches. Athletic therapy can be provided one hour prior to each match, although clubs must bring their own supplies for taping.

AIRPORT ARRIVALS

Teams will be met at the airport by a volunteer staff member and escorted to the bus pick-up area. Teams may be paired with another team arriving at a similar time.

The Local Organising Committee will provide arrival and departure support at Kamloops Airport (YKA).

TRANSPORTATION ON MATCH DAYS

All teams will be picked up from their hotel to ensure arrival at the competition fields between 60-90 minutes prior to the kick-off time. Travel time from the team hotel to the match field is approximately 10-15 minutes (detailed plans will be shared before the group phase).

Depending on your location, the bus will LEAVE the hotel between 60-90 minutes before your team's start time. Teams should be at the designated location 10 minutes prior to their departure. Teams may be paired together when traveling to the match fields; so, the bus may have more than one stop between multiple hotels.

Buses will be identified so that each team gets on the correct bus (look for a "team card" positioned near the front window of the bus). It is critical that teams board the correct team bus (please DO NOT board another team's bus for any reason). After your match and cool down (or as per your pre-assigned departure time), please proceed to the pick-up area. As a kind reminder, your bus needs to maintain their schedule so that other teams are not left waiting.

TRANSPORTATION PLAN

Blue Star will supply transportation. Transportation services are provided for the following:

To / from the airport

To / from one training session

To / from all matches

To / from ceremonies (if required)

To manage the overall event logistics, the cooperation of teams is critical. If you **DO NOT** require transportation, please email Duncan Olthuis at dolthuis@kamloopssportscouncil.com **by 12 September 2025**

Pick up / drop off locations will be at the main entrance of team hotel.

Teams are expected to be at the pick-up location 10 minutes prior to departure. Buses are not able to wait for teams or players and will be instructed to leave at their scheduled time.

Teams and staff are not permitted to use other buses to attend additional matches. If you would like to watch matches, you will need to coordinate your own transportation.

TRANSPORT COMMUNICATION PROTOCOL

All transportation has been coordinated between the Local Organising Committee and Blue Star.

A detailed transportation schedule, including pick-up and departure times, will be provided in early October. The Local Organising Committee will also provide an update each evening for the following day (starting 8 October).

TRANSPORTATION FOR TRAINING

Teams that book their (optional) one official training session may also be provided bus transportation to that training, with note that teams are dropped off five minutes before the training time and picked up immediately following the training time.

Optional training sessions can be booked on 7 and 8 October at McArthur Island Park from 08.00-20.00 local time. Training sessions can be booked by contacting Duncan Olthuis at dolthuis@kamloopssportscouncil.com. Times will be accommodated on a first-come, first-serve basis.

Teams who are training will be transported from their host hotel to the McArthur Island Park.

COMPETITION MEETINGS

To help prepare for Canada Soccer's National Championships, the following virtual and in-person meetings have been planned.

(Virtual) Pre-Arrival Meeting for Participating Clubs

Canada Soccer will coordinate a virtual (Zoom) pre-arrival meeting with all the Participating Clubs in August and September. At least one staff member from each Club must attend the meeting on one of these dates.

Option 1 – Monday 4 August at 15.00 ET / 12.00 PT

Option 2 – Wednesday 12 August at 19.00 ET / 16.00 PT

Option 3 – Thursday 4 September at 16.00 ET / 13.00 PT

Option 4 – Wednesday 24 September at 20.00 ET / 17.00 PT

The Canada Soccer Match Commissioner and General Coordinator will chair the Pre-Competition Meeting. The PTSO Representative along with a staff or coach from each club must attend the meeting. All clubs must bring one example of each of their player and goalkeeper shirts and socks to this meeting (which means all colour variations for both outfield players and goalkeepers).

Clubs that have players who need to wear a cast or brace must have that equipment checked by the Supervisor of Officials (clubs must RSVP with Canada Soccer if they are bringing additional equipment that needs to be approved by the Supervisor of Officials).

OPENING CEREMONY

Kamloops Sports will host an Opening Ceremony for all Participating Clubs at the Pow Wow grounds at Tk'emlúps te Secwepemc to mark the start of the competition. This event provides an opportunity to welcome participants, celebrate the host community, and set the tone for the week ahead. Further details including location, timing and any specific arrival instructions will be shared in advance by the LOC.

CANADA SOCCER AWARDS

Following the Final Matches on Monday 13 October, Canada Soccer will hold one ceremony to present awards and medals for both divisions. The presentation includes the Most Valuable Player award, referee medals, player medals, and the Winners' Trophy.
