NATIONAL AMATEUR COMPETITIONS

As Canada's most accessible sport, soccer welcomes more than 750,000 registered players across the nation. Each year, Canada Soccer supports more than 100 qualified teams to its national amateur competitions across the Futsal Canadian Championship (April), the Player-Development Program Championship (August), and the National Championships (October). In 2025, more than 1,300 amateur teams took part in men's and women's divisions in the adult, U-17 and U-15 age categories leading to Canada Soccer's national amateur competitions.

As Canada Soccer's largest national event featuring clubs from coast to coast to coast, the National Championships have served as the nation's primary amateur soccer competition for more than 100 years, with the men's competition inaugurated in 1913, the youth competition inaugurated in 1966, and the women's competition inaugurated in 1982. At all age levels, the National Championships provide a meaningful week-long soccer experience for host cities and participating teams, as well as the players, coaches, support staff, officials, and volunteers.

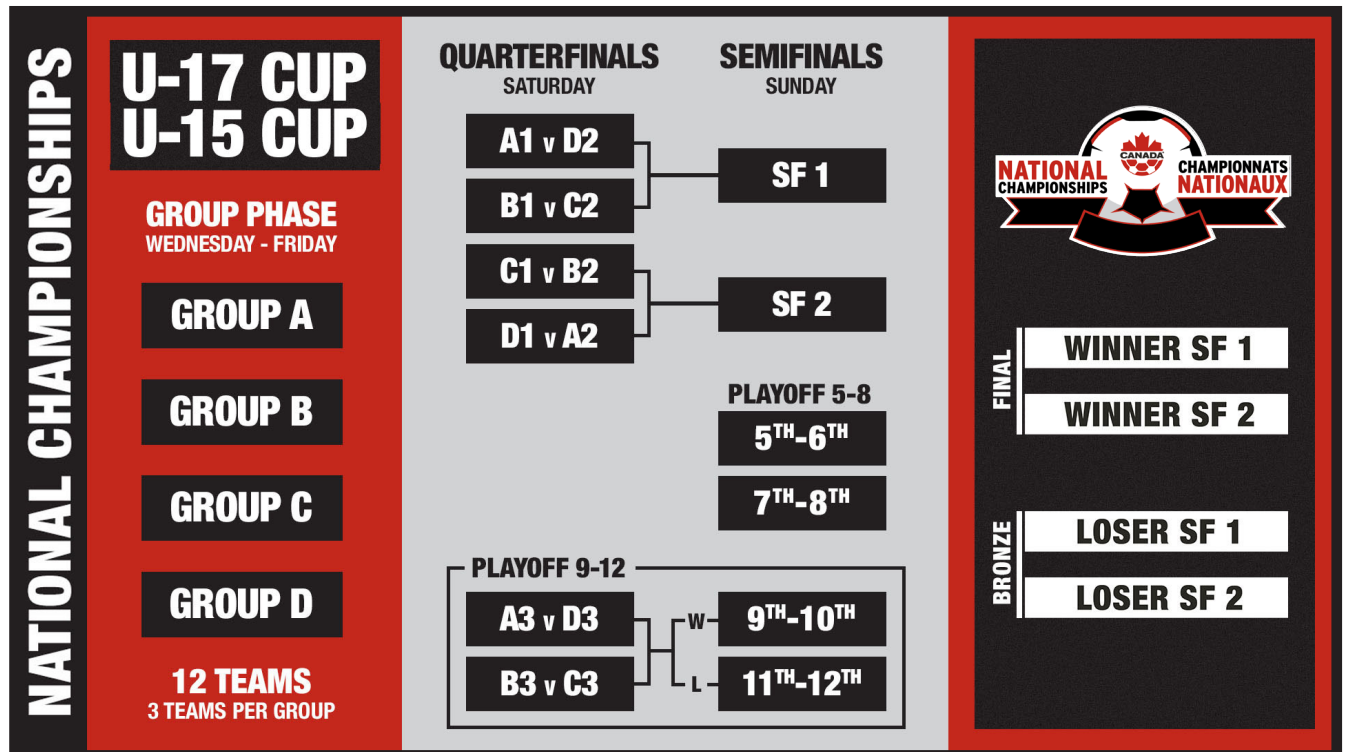


NATIONALS

As part of the Youth Competitions Network, an enhanced schedule for the Youth National Championships was introduced in 2025 whereby each division now features 12 qualified teams.

Group matches are played Wednesday through Friday followed by knockout and playoff matches from Saturday through Monday.

Each host welcomes the qualified teams to their community with a unique Opening Ceremony, friendly volunteers at each of the competition venues, transportation to and from the team hotels, and a Finals Day atmosphere whereby all teams are in attendance for the Canadian Finals.



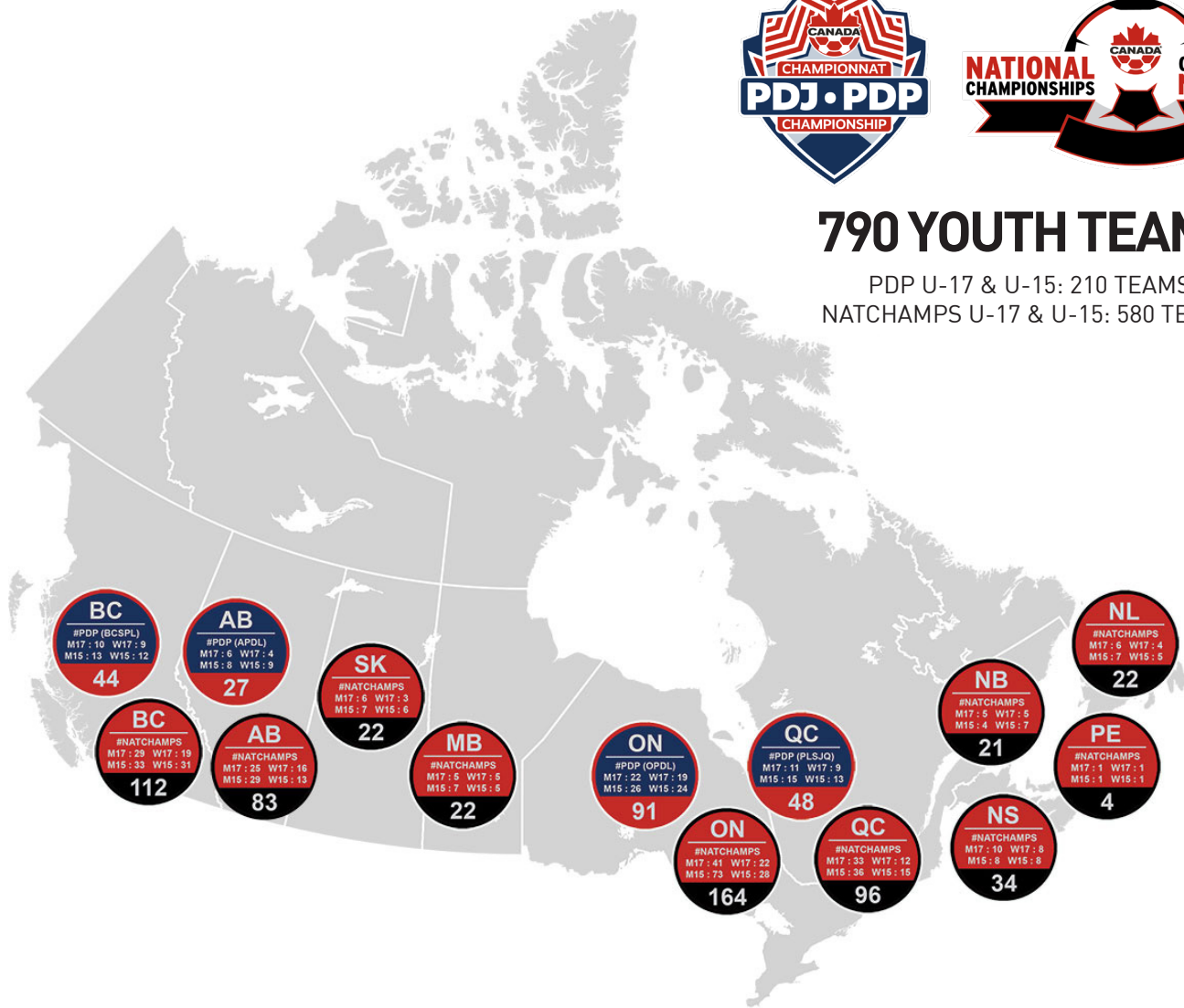
The opportunity to bid on hosting Canada Soccer's National Championships is open to all Canadian communities.

This past year alone, 580 youth teams took part in qualifying for the National Championships in the U-17 and U-15 age groups for both boys and girls. From that group, 12 youth teams qualified in each of the four divisions, with each venue hosting 24 qualified teams across the week-long event heading into the Canadian Finals on Thanksgiving Monday.

THE PATHWAY

Canada Soccer's Youth Competitions Network supports the pathway of young Canadian players from the amateur game to the professional and international levels. Both the PDP Championship in August as well as the National Championships in October provide a terrific growth opportunity for Canada's bright young players from coast to coast to coast across the country.

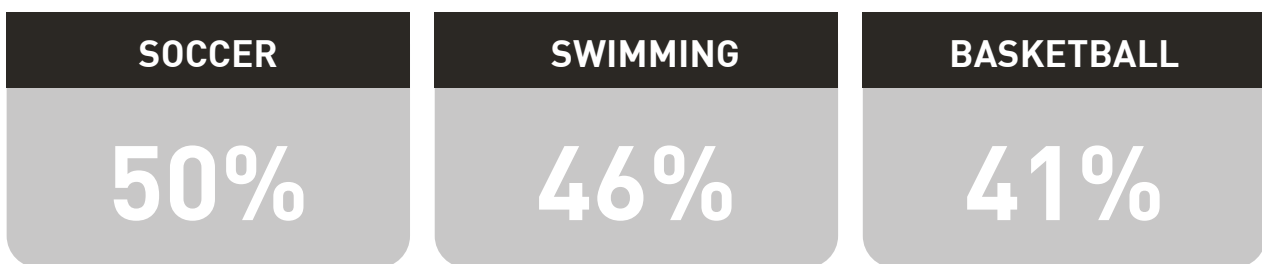




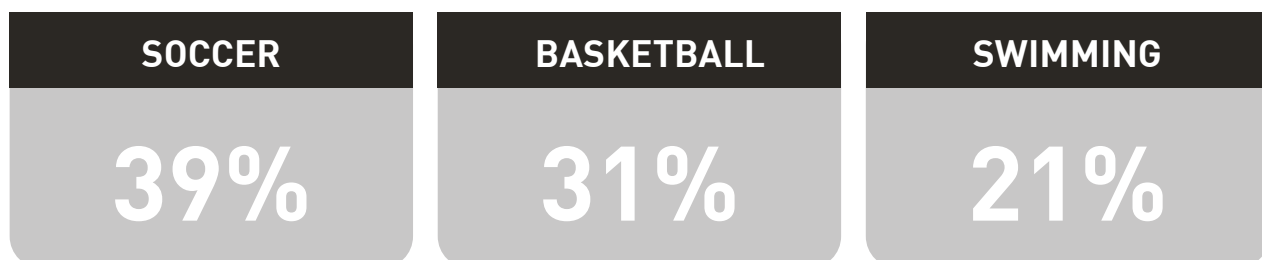
THE MOST ACCESSIBLE SPORT IN CANADA

Soccer has been Canada's largest, registered participation sport for more than 30 years. New national research on the State of Youth Sport in Canada, released by Canadian Tire Jumpstart Charities, reveals a sport system under pressure. The report highlights soccer as one of the country's strongest and fastest-growing opportunities to engage and inspire young people. Amid rising financial barriers, uneven access to quality programs, and growing demands on families, the report shows that Canadian youth continue to see enormous physical, mental, and social benefits from participating in sport with soccer topping the list.
