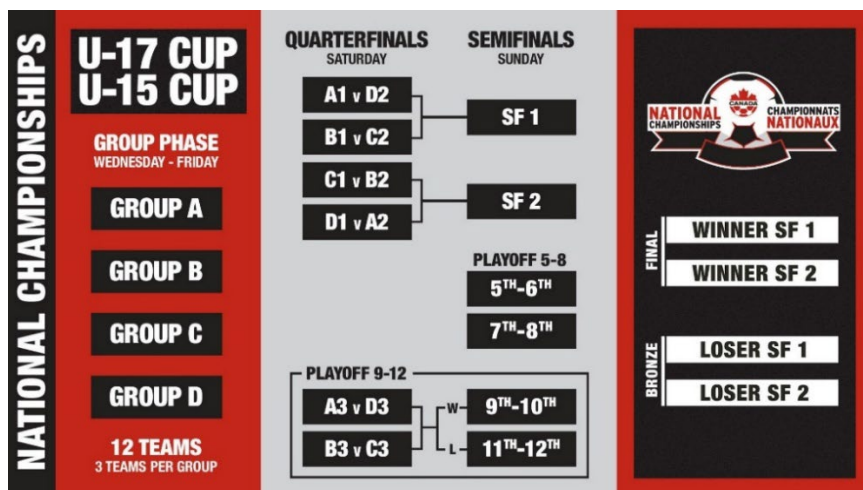

Canada Soccer's National Championships serves as a pinnacle event to the 2026 season, bringing together competitive clubs from across the country. This year's U-15 Cup will be played in Surrey, British Columbia from 6 to 12 October with 12 teams in the boys' division and 12 teams in the girls' division.

Canada Soccer will deliver all key information pertaining to its national amateur competitions via www.canadasoccer.com/competitions.

The 24 participating teams for the 2026 National Championships U-15 Cup qualify through their respective provincial leagues up until 12 September. In total, 180 boys' teams and 108 girls' teams competed in their provincial competitions to reach this stage. As part of the Youth Competitions Network, teams have taken part in 2025-26/2026 competitions leading to Canada Soccer's PDP Championship and youth National Championships.

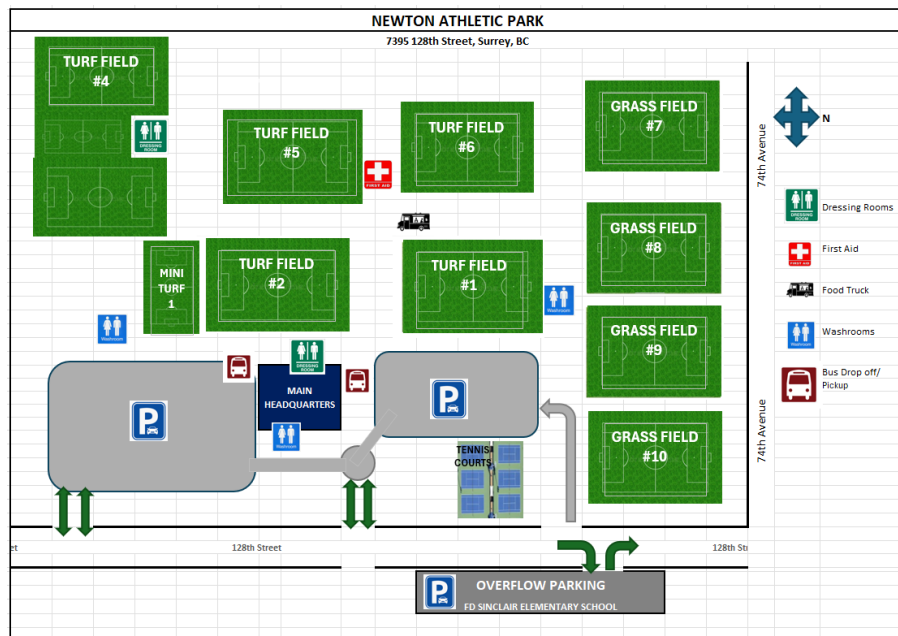

COMPETITION FIELDS & FACILITIES



In all, 52 matches will be played across the boys' and girls' divisions at the National Championships U-15 Cup, with the Final Matches played in succession on Thanksgiving Monday 12 October. All matches will be played at Newton Athletic Park in Surrey.

Training sessions

Dressing Rooms

Four permanent team dressing rooms are located in the Main Pavilion and four are located in the far northwest corner of the park (near Turf #4), each with showers and toilets. Your provincial flag will be displayed on your dressing room door. Gatorade and bottled water are stocked before each match by the Changeroom Manager. All items must be removed from the dressing rooms prior to kick-off.

Parking & Arrival

Parking at Newton Athletic Park is free, with 615 car spaces; FD Sinclair Elementary School across the street is available for overflow. Team buses drop off and pick up at the front of the Event Office, with designated zones at the north and south ends of the Clubhouse and a separate bus holding area.

Athletic Therapy / First Aid

An AED is available at each competition venue, alongside cervical collars, a trauma kit, first aid kits, concussion assessment tools, a wheelchair, crutches, ice and cooling supplies, emergency blankets and treatment tables.

One Life First Aid and Intercept Rehab & Sports Medicine will be onsite during the tournament.

Technical / Spectator Areas

Only accredited staff and players are permitted in the technical area. Spectator areas are separated from the field of play, and Field Marshals will keep emergency access routes clear at all times. Smoking is not permitted anywhere in the accredited areas.

It is important that Participating Clubs, their players and team staff respect the fields and facilities accordingly. Clubs are expected to keep their benches clean and tidy after each match or training session.

MEDICAL FACILITIES & PHARMACIES

First-Aid services will be provided for all matches. Athletic therapy can be provided one hour prior to each match, although clubs must bring their own supplies for taping.

The LOC Medical Services Coordinator is Denzil Sharma (780-518-5022). Ambulance access to all fields is via the main entrance off 128 Street, with secondary access through the park maintenance service road. In an emergency, call 911 first, then notify the Venue Supervisor. The emergency assembly area is the Tournament Headquarters parking lot, with the north parking lot at Newton Athletic Park as the secondary assembly point.

AIRPORT ARRIVALS

Teams will be met at the airport by their bus driver. On arrival, proceed to the Arrivals bus pick-up area at Vancouver International Airport - this is one floor below the baggage claim level. Your bus will display a sign in the front window. The driver's contact details will be provided to you in advance in the Airport Schedule document. Teams may be paired with another team arriving at a similar time; charter buses seat 50-56 passengers with ample space for luggage and team equipment.

The Local Organising Committee will provide arrival and departure support at Vancouver International Airport (YVR). Approximate distances from YVR: 36 km / 50 minutes to the Sheraton Vancouver Guildford Hotel; 32 km / 41 minutes to the Civic Hotel; 29 km / 33 minutes to Newton Athletic Park. On departure, teams should be dropped at the airport at least two hours - ideally two and a half hours - before their scheduled flight. Teams attending the Final matches may be scheduled to depart directly from Newton Athletic Park to the airport.

TRANSPORTATION ON MATCH DAYS

All teams will be picked up from their hotel to ensure arrival at Newton Athletic Park at least 60 minutes prior to kick-off (officially 50 minutes before kick-off, or 10 minutes before your scheduled warm-up). Travel time from the Sheraton Vancouver Guildford Hotel to Newton Athletic Park is approximately 20 minutes / 11.2 km (detailed plans will be shared before the group phase).

The bus will LEAVE the hotel between 60-90 minutes before your team's start time. Teams should be at the designated location 10 minutes prior to their departure. Teams that have played each other will not be scheduled onto the same bus. Return transport to the hotel typically departs within 45 minutes of the final whistle.

Buses will be identified so that each team gets on the correct bus (look for a “team card” positioned near the front window of the bus). It is critical that teams board the correct team bus (please DO NOT board another team’s bus for any reason). After your match and cool down (or as per your pre-assigned departure time), please proceed to the pick-up area. As a kind reminder, your bus needs to maintain their schedule so that other teams are not left waiting.

TRANSPORTATION PLAN

Alpine Bus Lines Ltd. will supply transportation using school buses.

Transportation services are provided for the following:

To / from the airport

To / from one training session

To / from all matches

To / from ceremonies (if required)

To manage the overall event logistics, the cooperation of teams is critical. If you DO NOT require transportation, please advise the LOC Ground Transportation Officer, Rob Bura (Robbura@gmail.com), by the deadline confirmed in your team transportation schedule. Teams approved to travel to the competition by ground must confirm whether they require local transport no later than two weeks before the competition. Teams may be charged for transportation costs arising from cancelled or delayed plans made without prior notice.

Pick up / drop off locations will be at the back entrance of the team hotel. At Newton Athletic Park, buses drop off and pick up at the front and behind the Event Office.

Teams are expected to be at the pick-up location 10 minutes prior to departure. Buses are not able to wait for teams or players and will be instructed to leave at their scheduled time.

Teams and staff are not permitted to use other buses to attend additional matches. If you would like to watch matches, you will need to coordinate your own transportation.

On the final day of competition, charter buses will be used for departing teams so that luggage can be carried and stored.

TRANSPORT COMMUNICATION PROTOCOL

All transportation has been coordinated between the Local Organising Committee and Alpine Bus Lines Ltd.

A detailed transportation schedule, including pick-up and departure times, will be provided in early October, and a team-specific schedule will be distributed at the Pre-Competition Meeting. The Local Organising Committee will also provide an update each evening for the following day (starting 7 October).

TRANSPORTATION FOR TRAINING

Teams that attend optional training sessions will be dropped off five minutes before their scheduled training time and picked up immediately following the session.

Optional training sessions can be booked at Hjorth Road Park from 6 to 9 October between 08.00 and 16.00, using the training request form linked above. Times will be accommodated on a first-come, first-serve basis.

Teams who are training will be transported from their host hotel to Hjorth Road Park. The training venue is approximately 1.7 km / 4 minutes from the team hotel via bus or 10-15 minute walk.

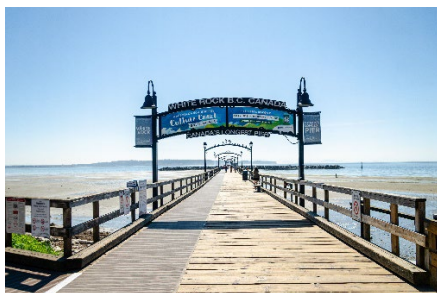

COMPETITION MEETINGS

To help prepare for the National Championship, Canada Soccer will lead virtual and in-person meetings. Before departure, a member of each qualified team must attend a virtual pre-arrival meeting (conducted via Zoom, with schedule shared through each respective PTSO). Upon arrival, at least one member of each qualified team must attend the Pre-Competition meeting along with the uniform & equipment check (starting at 19h15 local time).

Canada Soccer Pre-Competition Meeting on Tuesday 6 October 2026

The Canada Soccer Organising Committee will chair the Pre-Competition Meeting. The PTSO Representative along with a staff or coach from each club must attend the meeting. All clubs must bring one example of each of their player and goalkeeper shirts and socks to this meeting (which means all colour variations for both outfield players and goalkeepers).

Clubs that have players who need to wear a cast or brace must have that equipment checked by the Supervisor of Officials (clubs must RSVP with Canada Soccer if they are bringing additional equipment that needs to be approved by the Supervisor of Officials).

OPENING CEREMONY

The Local Organising Committee will host an Opening Ceremony for all teams to mark the start of the competition. This event provides an opportunity to welcome participants, celebrate the host community, and set the tone for the week ahead. The LOC will be hosting a banquet on Wednesday 7 October at the Grand Empire Banquet Hall from 17.00 to 21.00 for all players and team officials. Dinner will be provided, and the dress code for the evening is club wear. School buses will support transportation to and from the banquet.

CANADA SOCCER AWARDS

Following the Final Matches on Thanksgiving Monday 12 October, Canada Soccer will hold one ceremony to present awards for both divisions. The awards include the Most Valuable Player award, referee medals, player medals, and the Winners' Trophy. Each winning team will also receive a winners' banner, presented to the coach after the trophy presentation and before the team photo.

Both Final Matches will be played at Newton Athletic Park, with the Awards Ceremony scheduled for 14.00 local time on the main field (NAP #1). Flag bearers will be in place for both Final matches. After the ceremony, a Canada Soccer photographer will take individual photos of each of the winning players with the Winners' Trophy.
